

Minutes of a meeting of the Parish Council held at the Social Club Braeshfield on Monday the 6th June 1955 at 8 pm.

Present:- Messrs. Cottold, Parsons, Greenwood and Drummond.

Apology was received from Mrs. Bacon.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed.

Chairman. On the proposition of Mr. Cottold seconded by Mr. Greenwood Gen. A. H. Ransome ^{unopposedly} was re-elected Chairman of the Council.

V. Chairman. On the proposition of Mr. Greenwood seconded by Mr. Parsons Mr. Cottold was elected Vice Chairman of the Council.

Mr. Cottold. The Chairman welcomed Mr. Parsons to the Council and Mr. Parsons replied.

Procedure. The Clerk reported receipt of letter with regard to the Brighton to Southampton Service, stating that a meeting would be held on the 14th June of representatives of the Councils affected: after a full discussion on the Service Mr. Cottold was elected to attend the meeting and state the Council's views. The Clerk produced the table with regard to Bus Service to Standard. The Clerk was directed to 1.53 - 2.0 pm Service at the same time on all days of the week.

Church Lane The Clerk was directed to enquire when the surfacing work on Church Lane would be commenced.

Bus Shelter Mr. Hobbold raised the question of a Press statement that the Council was applying for a Grant from the Rates for the Shelter. It was agreed that no such application was to be made and that the Press be asked to correct the statement.

The interference with the free use of the highway outside the Wheatstone Public House owing to the Parking of motor cars was discussed and it was agreed that the Clerk should write to the Landlord thereon and if necessary report any application he would make to the Brewers for a Bad Park.

Loxpath. The Clerk was directed to write to the Devonshire Surveyor with regard to the Tenje Post at Loxpath Street to Tinsbury and the Right of Way through View to Pagus Hay at the Pagus Hay End.

The Clerk was also directed to write to Mr. Scott the botanist Church Lane with regard to does hanging the plant Trees.
