- (a) The Clerk read a letter from Mr. Bennett, the Divisional Surveyor saying if the potholes in the village were to be repaired.
- (b) It was reported that the drainage scheme for the village was now "being given attention" & that the R.D.C. appreciated the urgency of the situation.
- (c) It was also reported that the notification of Parish Councils of Planning applications was to be incorporated into the Local Government Bill.

meeting with the football clubs had been useful & the Council resolved that the two teams at present using the ground should be allowed to continue. The Clerk was asked to write to Dryhams & Dartrose.

The Clerk was instructed to find out the cost of litter bags to be positioned at the entrance.

Any Other Business


- (i) Mr. Brown explained the position of the sale of council houses in the village in relation to an apparently substantial profit made recently by a person who had purchased 18 months ago. He said the Housing Committee would investigate the situation.

- (ii) Mr. Brown also reported that

four garages may be erected at the end of Hill View Road. It was considered that possibly erecting four would not alleviate the problem of cars in the roadway & that a new council house could possibly be built instead.

- (iii) Mr. Brown told the meeting what he knew about the new Test Valley Authority.
