

Minutes of the meeting of the  
Braishfield Parish Council held  
on Monday 4<sup>th</sup> September at the  
Women's Institute at 8 p.m.

The Council stood in silence  
in memory of Mr. George Parsons.  
The Chairman said that he  
would be sadly missed by the  
Council & village alike. All  
Councillors paid tribute to him  
saying that he had taken a  
serious & deep interest in the  
village of Braishfield & its residents.

To Consider the vacancy caused by the death  
of the late Mr. George Parsons.

After discussion it was decided  
to ask Mrs. Bell of Potters Clay if  
she would be prepared to be  
nominated as a co-opted  
member of the Council.

Minutes The minutes of the meeting  
held on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> July were  
read & approved.

Matters Arising

- (1) Mr. D. Lowman said he would  
try & deal with the long grass in

## the Recreation Ground.

- (ii) The Clerk reported that he had not been able to find out about litter bags for the Recreation Ground but that he would try again.

## Correspondence

- (1) a letter was read regarding the Boundary Commission from the Department of the Environment.
- (2) The Clerk read a letter from the H.C.C. regarding dutch elm disease. It was important that any diseased trees be felled.
- (3) The N.F.U. had written requesting information regarding women's organisations in the village. The Clerk was instructed to write & tell him about the Women's Institute, the Mothers Union & the Young Wives Group.
- (4) a letter from the Hampshire + Isle of Wight P.F.A. suggesting the Council should make a donation towards the retirement gift of Mr. John Bell. It was decided to send £1.
- (5) The report of the Medical Officer of Health for the R.D.C. was presented.

## Recreation Ground

It was decided that the

Council should meet at 7.15 p.m.  
at the Recreation Ground at the  
October meeting.

The Clerk reported that the  
spraying of the Recreation Ground  
had been completed. It was  
agreed that the £5 contribution  
could be paid. A cheque was  
accordingly drawn & signed.

### Any Other Business

- (1) The Clerk reported that the Insurance Premiums had increased sharply. Nevertheless the Council resolved to continue the existing policies.
- (2) It was reported that a property near the Dog & Crook owned by Mrs. Erskine had an overgrown hedge overhanging the footpath. The Clerk was instructed to deal with this.
- (3) Mr. Lowman & Mr. Cobbold reported on a site meeting by the Planners at Mr. D. Tate's site. Everybody agreed it was an excellent site.
- (4) Other planning matters were considered.
- (5) Mr. Cobbold reported that footway No. 9 was very overgrown. The Clerk was instructed to deal with this.
- (6) Mr. Cobbold also reported on the recent new white lines at road

junctions in the village but thought that the junction near the Kernels should also be done. The Clerk was asked to get this done.

- (7) Miss Bacon wondered if the Clerk could do anything about the lack of white lines at the junction near Farley Church. The Clerk said he would try.
- (8) Mr. Brown announced that the plan to erect four garages in Hill View Road had been deferred and that the whole question of garages would be reconsidered.

Next meeting was fixed for Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October to start at 7.30pm at the Recreation Ground.

There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting.
